<a href="#">HB 2022</a>	<p>Requires:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Hospitals to conduct safety assessments, develop assault prevention and protection programs for employees, and requires training of employees. The safety assessment is to include, if available, five years of data on assaults that identifies the causes and consequences of all staff assaults;</li> <li>- A health care employer to develop an assault protection and prevention program, and staff training with multiple components as driven by the safety assessment, including the use of self-defense;</li> <li>- A health care employer to develop a program for post-incident counseling and follow-up. <a href="#">HB 2175</a>	<p>Authorizes DHS to use abuse and neglect reports to determine fitness of employees, providers and volunteers to provide care through Dept.</p> <p><b>Background</b> - For several years under existing law, DHS has required subject individuals to report abuse and neglect as “mandatory reporters” for both children and adults who are disabled. For children, these reports are sent to the DHS Children Adults and Family (CAF) and for adults to the Office of Investigations and Training (OIT). During this period of time, DHS has also required criminal background checks (CBC) be completed for subject individuals before they could begin working with clients and consumers served by DHS.</p> <p><b>AOCMHP: Support</b></p>	<p>Gives DHS the authority to coordinate criminal background checks (CBCs) with review of records of abuse and neglect maintained by OIT and CAF. This would improve the screening of subject individuals who have had substantiated allegations of abuse or neglect from resuming work with DHS clients. DHS is directed to develop administrative rules regarding the use of abuse and neglect records maintained by DHS and the CBC process conducted by the Criminal Records Unit (CRU).
