Children & Adolescents Mental Health Crisis Response Program

This program began in July of 2005 through joint funding by Lane County Behavioral Health Services and LaneCare, the Managed Health Organization for Lane County. The program is operated in partnership by three agencies, The Child Center, Looking Glass Youth and Family Services and Jasper Mountain. The services include 24/7 hotline, mobile crisis response throughout Lane County, facility based respite for young children at the SAFE Center, facility based respite at Station 7, ETC and Stepping Stone Lodge, family based respite, next day follow up for mobile crisis cases, referral to community services and facilitation of ongoing mental health services. The Crisis Response Program responds to crisis calls from families throughout all of Lane County both urban and rural. During the first three years of operation (July 2005-June 2008), there were a total number of 1,885 crisis cases. Of those cases, 35% required a mobile response by the crisis team. 59% were children 12 and younger. Lane County considers the Child Crisis Program a resounding success.

Mental Health Court

The Lane County Mental Health Court began operation on September 1, 2003 with a two year grant of \$150,000 awarded through the US Department of Justice. The Mental Health Court was first initiated within Circuit Court. Enrollment proceeded slowly and when budgetary cutbacks were made in the District Attorney's office in early 2004, Lane County Behavioral Health Services sought another partner to continue the Mental Health Court. Lane County and the City of Eugene Municipal Court formed a partnership in August 2004 to operate the Mental Health Court and have continued that partnership with the City of Eugene providing \$100,000 per year in funding and Lane County Behavioral Health Services providing mental health services and related support services (housing, vocational skills training, crisis assistance). To date, the Mental Health Court has had 239 referrals for mental health services.

Lane County Transition Team

This is a partnership between Lane County Behavioral Health Services and PeaceHealth Oregon Region, the community hospital in Lane County. Funding is provided by both Lane County and PeaceHealth. Three qualified mental health practitioners provide direct emergency psychiatric services including intensive community based services to individuals with psychiatric disorders who may be at risk of non-compliance with treatment and/or readmission to the acute psychiatric care hospital. The Transition Team provides direct services to individuals recently discharged from psychiatric settings; evaluation and assessment of a client's readiness to leave the hospital or subacute setting and collaboration with the inpatient staff to develop the appropriate level and intensity of wrap around services needed for the client to be successful in the community. The transition team assertively engages the client in the discharge plan and meets with the clients on an individual basis to support them in meeting their goals for recovery. The Transition Team has been operating in Lane County since May, 2004.



Integrated Primary Care and Behavioral Health

In October 2007, Lane County Behavior Health Services became a Federally Qualified Health Center at the clinic location of 2411 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. in Eugene. This designation will provide access to comprehensive medical and behavioral health care as an integrated medical home for clients. The clinic was remodeled to accommodate two primary care physician offices. The clinic also offers pharmacy services for their clients. It is hoped that this integration of Behavioral and Physical health care will allow us to make an impact on the 25 year shorter lifespan reported in individuals with severe and persistent mental illness and provide a more holistic approach to comprehensive care.
